SNOWMAN MAGNET CRAFT INSTRUCTIONS

Supplies Needed: Craft Sticks, paint (white, black), orange craft foam, magnet tape, wiggle eyes, red ribbon and small buttons.

- Paint six craft sticks white with the top 2 inches of the six white sticks black (to form the hat).
- 2. Paint one craft stick entirely black.
- 3. Glue the six white craft sticks to a cardboard scrap to hold them together. Add I inch piece of magnet tape to the back.
- 4. Glue the black craft stick down to create the brim of the hat, as shown.
- 5. Glue the wiggle eyes on to the snowman's face. Cut out a triangle of orange craft foam (the carrot nose) glue on to the snowman's face.
- 6. Wrap the ribbon around the brim of the hat and glue the ends in place on the back.
- 7. Glue each of the small stones or buttons to the snowman's face in the shape of a smile.

1 (21 ounce) Can Cherry Pie Filling


Family favorite

- Must be a credit union member in good standing for at least three years prior to running Must make your interest known to the Nominating Committee by January 31, 2013*
- A mandatory meeting will be held where candidates will be interviewed by the Nominating Committee and duties will be covered.

Board members serve as non-paid volunteers. For potential Board members, education or work experience in finance, accounting, human resources or marketing is helpful. - Always keep your credit or debit card in a safe and secure place. Treat it as you would cash or checks.
- Do not send your card number through email, as it is typically not secure. Do not give out your card number over the phone unless you initiated the call.
- Regularly review your account statements as soon as you receive them or anytime online with eStatements to verify transactions.
- If you receive a replacement card, destroy your old
- Memorize your PIN. Don't write it down anywhere and never share it with anyone.
- Shop with merchants you know and trust.
- Make sure any internet purchase activity you engage in is secured with encryption to protect your account information. Look for "secure transaction" symbols like a lock symbol in the lower right-hand corner of your web browser window, or "https://..." in the address bar of the website. The "s" indicates "secured" and means the web page uses encryption.
- Always log off from any website after a purchase transaction made with your credit or debit card.


